

College Credit Plus

Cleveland Preparatory Academy participates in College Credit Plus, which is Ohio's dual enrollment program that provides students in grades 7-12 the opportunity to earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking courses from Ohio colleges or universities. The purpose of this program is to enhance students' career readiness and postsecondary success, while providing a wide variety of options to college-ready students, at no or limited costs to students and families.

Students have two Post-Secondary Options:

Option A: House Bill 215 allows students to enroll in college courses during the summer or in the evenings for both high school and college credit. With Option A, all costs of tuition, books, materials and fees are the responsibility of students and their parents/guardians.

Option B: Enrollment in college courses for both high school and college credit: The school district and the college will pay for all costs of tuition, books materials and fees based upon the number of courses taken and if the student meets specific qualifications

If a student fails or withdraws from a course after the deadline, the student is responsible for all tuition and book costs.

Grades earned in CCP courses will be weighted.

Prior to April 1st, the student and her parents/guardians must complete the CCP Intent to Participate for the following school year to the school administration. If a student fails to provide meet this deadline, the student must obtain written consent from the Principal.
