The three course types include:

Traditional Courses are taught face to face in a traditional classroom setting five days per week.

Hybrid Courses allow for independent work in a lab setting to alternate with a twice per week, face to face classroom setting. Hybrid courses are an ideal way for students to learn to manage their academic schedule independently while allowing for accountability and the additional support of an onsite instructor.

Virtual Courses enable independent work in a lab setting throughout the week. The teacher is off site but meets with the students in a synchronous web based session at least once weekly. Virtual courses afford students the opportunity to exercise the most independence in their academic choices. They enable the school to offer a variety of elective and advanced courses that students might not otherwise have access to.

Cleveland Prep Panther Prowlers are scheduled for five courses each day. All students are issued a laptop, which they use for accessing all classwork. They take their computers home with them daily and can access their classes 24/7 from this or any other internet connected device (smart phones included!).

Below are some examples of what a typical day might look like for a Cleveland Prep Panther Prowler. During this transitional period into high school, students will be permitted graduated levels of independence in their schedules and learning styles.

CCP: College Credit Plus. This is Ohio's dual enrollment program that allows for students to earn college credit while working towards their high school graduation requirements. Depending upon the course, it may be taken online from the Cleveland Prep campus or onsite at the college.

Course Locations:

- **Classroom:** Traditional classroom setup with teacher onsite.
- **Study Area/Classroom:** Hybrid class that alternates between working independently in a study area and meeting with the teacher in the classroom.
- **Study Area:** Open, shared spaces. Students rotate in and out of these areas throughout the day. Examples of these areas include:

Study Area A: Traditional Lab Setting with individual work stations.

Study Area B: Relaxed Setting with a combination of tables and individual work stations.

Study Area C: College Lounge Setting with a variety of furniture conducive to reading such as sofas and chair spaces.
